## F1 in Schools comes to Illawarra

On 29 November 2013 the exciting F1 in Schools program was launched in the Illawarra for the first time.

Warrawong High School will be the Hub School and linked schools to the hub will be Figtree High School, Edmund Rice College and Cedars



Christian College to compete in the Illawarra regional challenge in 2014.

Year after year Australian Schools stand on the winner's podium and again last week Australia collected not only the solid crystal Bernie Ecclestone F1 in Schools World Trophy but also a total of 5 awards including Engadine High School's

team, Motion Racing Team which won the best Team Display and were finalists in best verbal presentation, held in Texas.

Students as young as 10 are designing, testing and making miniature F1 cars capable of 100km/h.

But it is not about fast cars. F1 in Schools is a holistic action learning program which focuses on developing long term employability skills. Students learn leadership, team building, project management, business planning, public speaking, marketing, collaboration, computer aided drafting, writing and presentation skills.

Many students engaged in this program have been offered employment by industry before completing their studies, others are pursued by universities with competing scholarships... and one has even been head hunted into the real world of Formula1 racing as an aerodynamics engineer.

This is a great program and I am thrilled to have helped introduce F1 in Schools for the first time in the Illawarra, and to see the passion and commitment from schools here to get their students involved next year and beyond.
